## Lay Visitation Ministry

It was noted at our last meeting that a number of our UMW members are now homebound or living in retirement facilities. Drew Willson. They can arrange for a team to start making these visits. Visits are made by teams of two Trinity members approximately once a month in order to bring the love and fellowship of Trinity to our members who are no longer able to worship in our church building. Visits usually last about 20 minutes, are scheduled with the visitee in advance, and generally include conversation, prayer, scripture, and (if desired by the visitee) Holy Communion.

Box Tops for Education the value of \$42.20 were delivered in mid-October to Oak Grove-Bellemeade Elementary School. Box Tops for Education help provide funding for special projects and needs. The Oak Grove ES volunteers greatly appreciate these gifts. Trinity is on a three-year rotation schedule to donate the Box Tops to Tuckahoe Middle, The Charterhouse & Day Schools at UMFS, and OGES.



## Literacy Team Program at Oak Grove Elementary School

Literacy Teams target the lowest performing students in Grades K and 1. Volunteers work individually with two students from 9:20-10:50 for the morning program or 2:15-3:15 in the afternoon. Volunteers use selected "sight word" flash cards, alphabet recognition cards, early reader books, games, and other tools to help students gain confidence and fluency in reading. Volunteers also fill out a weekly report form on each student. Now in its 4th year, the Literacy Team data reveals a huge difference in the selected students' ability to score over the benchmark level in reading, not to mention the value of the personal effect of working one-on-one with a caring adult for an entire school year. Volunteers access materials from the Literacy Cabinet in the Teachers' Lunchroom alcove adjacent to the Cafetorium. The Samaritan Program is an integral part of the mission of Pinnacle Living which supplies financial assistance to residents unable to meet the full cost of services. During this past year \$1,036,610 was provided in benevolent support to residents in United Methodist Homes. Trinity has again been recognized as one of the top congregations to help in this way. A great deal of appreciation goes to our members who have been loyal in support the program.

The Hermitage Bazaar and Bake Sale was a huge success in October. Many thanks go to those who contributed baked goods and other items for the sale. Through these sales we are able to enrich the lives of residents by purchasing items that are needed. A recent decision was to use funds to buy up to six Coffee Servers, refurbish the piano bench in the Social Hall, and to purchase 2 sets of crowd control stanchions as well as an additional wall mounted unit.

## Rolling Up Our Sleeves to Save Lives

How proud we are of the remarkable turnout for our Fall VBS Drive on Sunday, October 8. People poured into Trinity Hall to donate their precious blood, something that money can never buy. Pastor Larry helped people understand the urgency of meeting blood donation needs in Las Vegas, as well as in our own community. Thanks to Bill Pike, our Forest Avenue signage brought in three neighbors. We had six brand new donors. Two of our staff members showed up to donate, too. Our grand total for October is 35 life-saving blood products: 27 whole blood, 4 platelets, and 2 double red donations which equal 4 units. Our next drive is January 14. Remember that each blood product helps save three lives.
